Memorial Stadium Tours

Originally completed in 1923, Memorial Stadium is undergoing seismic, safety and programmatic upgrades. We hope you can join us for this special preview of the upgraded stadium, which may include the playing field, plaza and concourse levels, seating bowl, and pressbox.

- All attendees need to wear work boots and long pants. Hard hats, safety vests and glasses will be provided.
- There is considerable walking required on this tour, including climbing the stadium bleacher steps and other stairways. All participants need to be able to navigate stairs and constricted spaces.
- Parking is limited on Centennial Dr. (permit required). Consider taking the "H" shuttle from BART for \$1.00.

Doe Memorial Library Tours

Tuesday, June 5, 10am - 11:30, and Wednesday, July 11, 2pm-3:30

The Doe Memorial Library is Cal's primary library for humanities, social sciences, and international and area studies. Named after its benefactor, Charles Franklin Doe, it was designed by John Galen Howard in the Beaux Arts style and was completed in 1911. The Doe/Moffitt libraries house both the undergraduate and Gardner Main Stacks collections as well as the Morrison Library, Art History/Classics Library, and the South/Southeast Asia Library.

After the tour, retirees will be given the opportunity to get a UC Berkeley Library card if they do not already have one. You must bring your Retiree ID and photo ID with you to the Library if you plan to obtain a card. If you do not yet have a Retiree ID, please request one when you register for this program.

UC Botanical Garden Plants of the World Tour

Established in 1890, the UC Botanical Garden at Berkeley has over 13,000 different kinds of plants from around the world, cultivated by region in naturalistic landscapes over its 34 acres. Join us for a free, docent-led tour of the Garden's collection, including environments as diverse as deserts, tropical forests, redwood forests, and wetlands.

A University parking lot about 50 yards up the hill and across the road from the Garden entrance offers **very limited** parking. Parking is \$1.50 for one hour and \$0.50 for each half hour thereafter. Be mindful of the time, as this lot is patrolled regularly by UC Parking & Transportation. Carpooling is encouraged, as parking is limited. You may also take the "H" campus shuttle from BART or the Hearst Mining Circle for \$1.00.

Since weather in Strawberry Canyon can be unpredictable, jackets or sweaters are a good idea. The site is hilly with many unpaved paths. Wear sturdy walking shoes. This tour will take place rain or shine.

EMERITI AND RETIREES OF DISTINCTION

Iola James - Distinguished Retiree



Iola James is known for her leadership, inexhaustible energy and the warmth and support that she shares with the UC Retirees' Association at Berkeley (UCRAB) and other University committee and policy board members.

Iola graduated from San Francisco State University, armed with a BA Degree in Elementary Education. Soon after graduation, Iola accepted a position in the Public Relations Department of Pacific Telephone and Telegraph in San Francisco. She became the Sports Editor for the company newspaper and wrote the "Bay Area Beat," column, featuring company "gossip" and current events.

After many years of commuting to San Francisco, a friend suggested that Iola consider a career at UC Berkeley. Iola applied for a position in the Agricultural Extension Services Department and because of her previous experience, became the Editor for the Agricultural Extension Services newsletter. She later accepted a position in the Office of Admissions and Records. Sensing that Campus would be her career employer, Iola later settled in the College of Engineering where she became Manager of the Undergraduate Student Affairs Office and Assistant to the Associate Dean. Iola retired from the College of Engineering after 30 years of campus service. Counseling and advising young engineering students remains the highlight of Iola's Campus career.

While working in the College of Engineering, Iola was elected as president of the Berkeley Campus Black Staff and Faculty Organization. Iola and members of (BSFO) met with the Chancellor and other administrators to present their unique needs and concerns. Iola was an Executive Committee Member of the National Forum for Black Public Administrators' Oakland-San Francisco Bay Area Chapter and received the (NFBPA) distinguished

Outstanding Chapter Services Award.

Iola planned to work after retirement, as she couldn't imagine just "sitting around" at home. Within one week after retirement, she started working part-time in Public Relations and has since worked for several agencies including the San Francisco Convention and Visitor's Bureau. Iola continues to enjoy her PR work.

Iola has served two terms as President of UCRAB and has served on the Executive Board for 10 years. In addition to being UCRAB President, Iola is the Trip Coordinator, offering members wonderful travel excursions throughout the Bay Area and beyond. Members and their guests regularly express their gratitude for her trips. Iola is also a representative on the Council of University of California Retirees' Associations (CUCRA) and a member of the UCB Retirement Center's Policy Board. She has been the (UCRAB) representative to the Association of Retirement Organizations in Higher Education (AROHE).

Iola is very active in the community. She is the President of both the Patrons of The Arts and Humanities of the Bay Area, Inc. and the C'est La Vie Social and Civic Club. She is a volunteer ambassador for the Lend A Hand Foundation. She is the past-President of the Oakland Dalian, China Sister City Society. She is an active lifetime member of the National Council of Negro Women. Most notable is her commitment to the Berkeley Bay Area Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., an international organization with a membership of over 200,000 women, where Iola has served as Chapter President and been appointed to national and regional committee positions. The Deltas will celebrate their Centennial in 2013 and Iola is very much a part of the planning for this historical event.

Iola loves to travel and has visited Egypt, Senegal, Mali, Ivory Coast, Mexico, Western Europe, Greek Isles, the Bahamas, Jamaica, Japan, China, Haiti, Trinidad, Tobago, Puerto Rico, Canada, and across the US.

The love of Iola's life is her daughter Monica, a UC Berkeley Alumna, and her three wonderful grandchildren. Her beloved husband of 25 years, Albert, passed away several years ago. Iola enjoys the closeness of her family, who reside in the area and she sees often.

LEARNING IN RETIREMENT

Ansel Adams and Clark Kerr

Organized by Professor Emerita Louise George Clubb

In 1963 President Clark Kerr commissioned Ansel Adams to imagine the future of the UC system by photographing 1,000 images. Adams became so captivated by the project that he produced 6,700 negatives and 605 signed prints, all of which the Regents own. The culmination of the commission was a book entitled Fiat Lux published in 1967 in collaboration with the writer Nancy Newhall for the UC Centennial. Now, in Fall 2012, fifty years into the future that Clark Kerr envisaged, The Bancroft Library is opening the Fiat Lux Redux exhibition, displaying the Fiat Lux images as a collection for the first time on the Berkeley campus.

Not long before the opening of the exhibition Sheldon Rothblatt's book entitled *Clark Kerr's World of Higher Education Reaches the 21st Century: Chapters in a Special History* will be published. These two events evoking both the past and the future of the University invite discussion from all quarters of the University.
