Ford Roosevelt began as the Executive Director of the Presidential Yacht organization in March 2022.

Before this, Ford worked as a non-profit executive and educator, human rights advocate, and non-profit leader for nearly forty years. He has been involved in pre-K-16 education and education reform for over 40 years. He has spoken on the issues of education access and equity as a human right issue around the country and the world. Additionally, as an active member of the Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt Institute, he has represented the

Roosevelt legacy in numerous contexts. Ford's engagement with the USS Potomac is an ongoing link to the Roosevelt legacy and particularly to the legacy of his grandparents, Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt.

Harvey Smith is the current President of the National New Deal Preservation Association and an expert on New Deal art. He is a Cal grad with degrees in



English and an MA in Public Health. He is the author of New Deal Berkeley (Arcadia Press, 2014) and currently a Vice-President of the Living New Deal non-profit board of directors.
