Professor Full is a Howard Hughes Medical Institute Professor of Integrative Biology at the University of California at Berkeley. Professor Full received his undergraduate, masters, and doctoral degrees at SUNY Buffalo and then held a postdoctoral position at The University of Chicago. He holds a joint appointment in Electrical Engineering and Computer Science and is a member of the Graduate Groups in Biophysics and Science and Mathematics Education in the Graduate School of Education. He is the founder and director of the Center of Interdisciplinary Bioinspiration in Education and Research (CiBER). #### **Universal Membership**

Staff retirees made the conscious decision to join UCRAB for a variety of reasons – to take advantage of our informational talks, to attend social events, to reconnect with former coworkers or to meet new friends.

Last year, the UCRAB board of directors met to discuss a couple of challenges: to expand access to our programs and to better reflect our population.

When we talked to the other retiree associations – UC Berkeley Emeriti Association (UCBEA); Lawrence Berkeley National Lab (EX-Ls) and President's and Regent's Retiree Association Advocacy (PARRA) – we found that they no longer collect dues. All individuals who fall into each group's purview are considered members.

UCRAB's board decided to follow this model and, effective June 30, 2021 are no longer collecting membership fees. This enables us to better align with the other Retirement Center associations and also lifts the definition of "member" to include *all* retired Berkeley staff and non-Senate academic appointees.

As the other organizations do, UCRAB will seek voluntary donations to support our ongoing programs, keep our delegation engaged in the Council of UC Retiree Associations and facilitate our ongoing relationship with the Retirement Center.

We're grateful for your past dues payments, and we hope you feel positively about this news. When UCRAB reaches out for financial support, we ask that you respond generously, with the knowledge that your support will be deeply appreciated.


