2024 UCRAB Board Election

UCRAB elects five members annually to replace or reinstate positions on our 10 member board. The board is elected by UCRAB general membership in person at our June meeting. All staff and nonacademic senate retirees who are present are eligible to vote.

At the June business meeting to be held June 18 at The Faculty Club, we will also seek nominations from the floor before holding the election.

Two members, **Kurt Libby and Marty Takimoto** seek reelection. Two members, **Elise Woods** and **Patti Owen** seek election to other positions.

Board members continuing terms ending in 2025 are **At-large Director Marian Gade** and **at-large Director Alma Valencia Gross**.

At-large Directors David Duer and Valerie Ventre-Hutton will not seek an additional term and will step down. The UCRAB Board and UC Retirement Center thanks Dave and Valerie for their contributions to the board.

The nominations committee proposes the following candidates for election to two-year term from July 2024 through June 2026:

President: Elise Woods

Elise Woods, has been the treasurer of the UC Berkeley Retirees' Association (UCRAB) since 2018, the UCRAB CUCRA representative from 2023,UC Retirees Travel trip escort, 2024, and a UC Davis alumna. Elise's 36-year career in the UC system covered a broad range of administrative roles. Retired in 2018, she worked on three campuses, UCSB, UCOP, and UCB, where in her last role she was the chief administrative officer of the UCB Libraries.

Vice President: Marty Takimoto

Marty graduated from Cal in 1979. He enjoyed a 34-year career in student services and student affairs, serving in increasingly important roles ranging from a pre-admissions advisor to Director of Communications and Marketing, Residential and Student Service Programs. Marty was on the Cal intramural fastpitch softball championship team two years in a row, and he retired in 2015. He is currently the Vice President.

At-large Director: Kurt Libby

Kurt graduated from the University of Minnesota. He has a BA in English and an MS in Management. He spent 30 years as an officer in the U.S. Navy. Following the Navy, he spent five years as a consultant before coming to UC Berkeley in 1999 as Director of Material Management. He retired in 2013. He has served on the UCRAB since 2020

At-large Director: Andy Yang

Andy received his A.B from Berkeley and his J.D. from Harvard Law School. Over the years he has held a number of positions, first at Harvard, and then at four different UC campuses (Berkeley, San Francisco, Los Angeles, and Irvine.) Most of his positions have been in the development/fundraising area. He served as Assistant Dean for Advancement at Berkeley from 2008-2010. He hopes his experience at the different UC campuses will bring a new perspective to the board.

The nominations committee proposes the following candidate for election to a one-year term from July 2024 through June 2025:

Secretary: Patti Owen

Patti is a graduate of UC Santa Barbara and began work at Berkeley in 1975 in the Academic Personnel Office. She spent 10 years in the Engineering Dean's Office, almost five years at Office of the President, and over 15 years in Academic Personnel. She retired in 2009 as the Assistant Vice Provost for Academic Personnel. She has been a member of the UC Berkeley Retirement Center Board since 2011 and has served as its chair. She joined UCRAB in 2015 and has served as President for the past 4 years.

Report from CUCRA and CUCEA

CUCRA. Council of UC Retiree Associations. along with the Council of Emeriti Associations (CUCEA) met April 23-25, 2024, via Zoom. The first morning was a joint meeting where we had a conversation with Nathan Brostrom, Vice President and Chief Financial Officer, at UC Office of the President. He reported on the budget (not good news) and the debacle of FAFSA (the federal student financial aid form.) He took a number of questions related to faculty/staff housing, the campus protests, and the budget. Then the Associate Vice President for Total Rewards, Jay Henderson, outlined some upcoming RFPs (Request for Proposals) as they relate to compensation and employee satisfaction. He expects the projects will be deployed in the Fall. Susan Pon-Gee, the Interim Executive Director of Benefits outlined the 2024 Health Care Planning. There will be no changes to health plan providers. The service provided by the Retirement Administrative Services Center (RASC) has been problematic for several years. The Executive Director, Bernadette Green, presented a number of slides showing the current state of the unit, including the number of contacts, time it takes to process retirement forms, etc. Sue Barnes, the

volunteer director of the CUCRA Travel Program, said that the program offered over 20 trips and earned CUCRA about \$60,000 last year.

On the second morning, CUCRA met. The Chair provided an update of activities since the last meeting. The participants then discussed the issues presented the day before. The next meeting is **October 30-31** and will be a hybrid meeting hosted by UC Santa Cruz.

<u>UC Retirees' Travel</u> is sponsored by the Council for UC Retiree Associations (CUCRA), a nonprofit organization comprised of volunteer representatives from each University of California retiree association.
